## About us

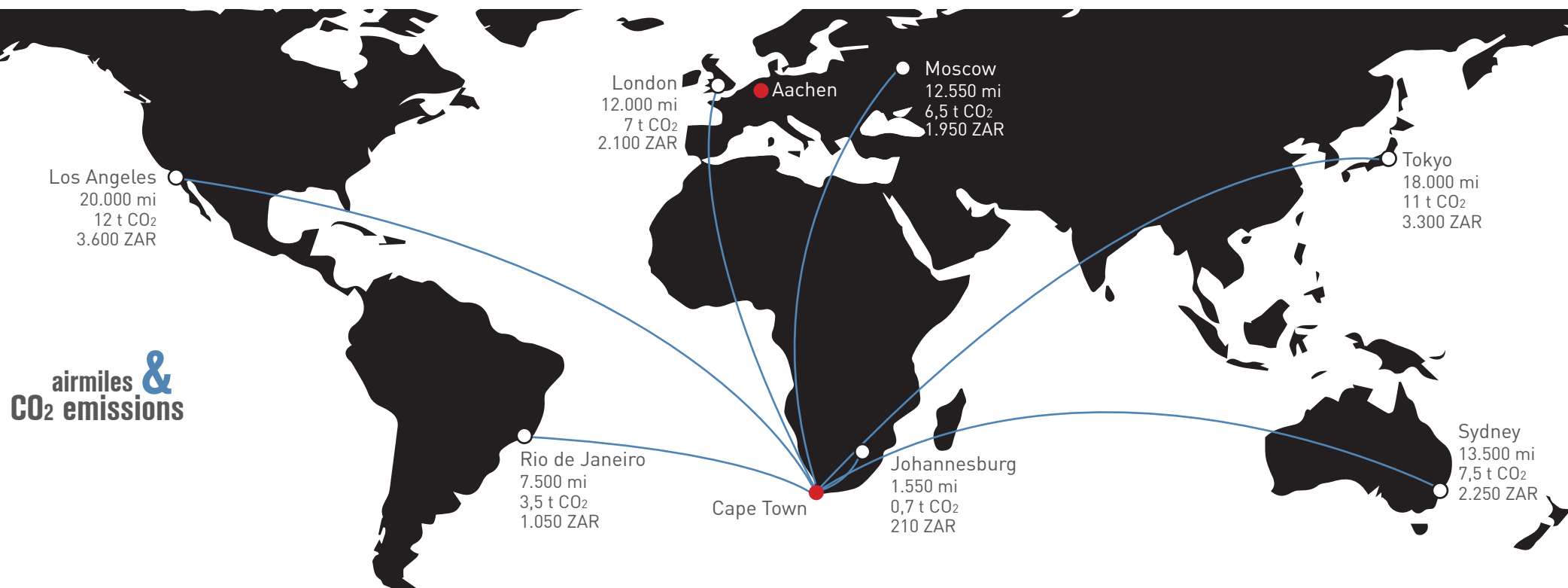
Climate Ticket Cape Town is a project of the Cape Town Aachen partnership. The partnership between these two cities, one in South Africa and one in Germany, is based on the principles of global sustainability and partnerships at a local level as outlined in Agenda 21. Amongst others, the goals of Agenda 21 are to eradicate extreme poverty and hunger, and to ensure environmental sustainability.

Many projects have been completed since the beginning of the partnership in 1999.

Members of local government and non-governmental organisations of both cities work together on different projects which foster sustainable development on both sides. Thanks to Climate Ticket Aachen, which has existed since 2009, people in Aachen have off-set their carbon footprints by funding various projects within the partnership. ## abalimi bezekhaya harvest of hope

“Harvest of Hope” is a project by Abalimi Bezekhaya, in which unemployed township residents of all ages are encouraged and supported to grow their own organic vegetables to feed their families and to sell their produce to markets outside the immediate neighbourhood.

Farmers benefit from a secure and fair income, customers benefit from reasonably-priced and locally-produced organic vegetables, and the environment benefits through organic community gardens which are at the same time nature conservation oases.

## engineers without borders

Engineers without borders South Africa provides underprivileged communities with access to technologies and skills to improve their quality of life.

Engineers without borders and associates wish to further develop and replicate a biogas unit in community gardens. The successful pilot in Khayelitsha is fed by garden waste that, in turn, produces methane gas. This gas is then used for a stove in the community kitchen. Another outcome of the biogas digester is an organic fertiliser, which is used for gardening.

## greenpop treevolution

Environmental education is essential! Children need to reconnect with nature and learn to respect it. In addition to this, lack of food and malnutrition is the biggest problem in South African schools.

Greenpop plants trees with learners and teaches them valuable environmental lessons. The trees beautify schools and communities, and create shady places for children to play. After planting, the learners get empowered to take responsibility for their trees.

## oude molen food garden village

The Food Garden Village is situated in the Oude Molen Eco Village and began as an educational and empowerment programme for children and youth.

It creates an afternoon gardening programme, in which children from the neighbouring communities can grow their own crops and receive environmental education. A second project is the Valkenberg occupational therapy programme, in which clients of the Valkenberg Psychiatric Hospital get the opportunity to work in the garden village and to be reintegrated into working life.
