

# Climate Ticket Gardens 2022

In 2004, the city partnership developed the climate ticket. This allows people from Aachen to reduce emissions and thus support vegetable gardens and ecological projects in Cape Town. We support each garden with about 500,- to 1000,- Euro. Two years ago we started to build up a network in Cape Town. With your donation for the climate ticket, we now support twelve projects.



## Lerotholi Agri Hub & Farm

An agri hub is being built in the heart of Langa, which can be used by the allotment gardeners in Langa. Vegetables will be washed, packaged and cooled there in order to market them themselves.

## Streetscapes – Kuilsriver Farm

Streetscapes work with homeless people who get jobs in the projects. In Kuilsriver, a "small farm" is "small farm".



## Soneike High School

Soneike High School has developed an impressive initiative to introduce horticulture education as a school subject and to establish vegetable plots. The cultivation is the task of the students.



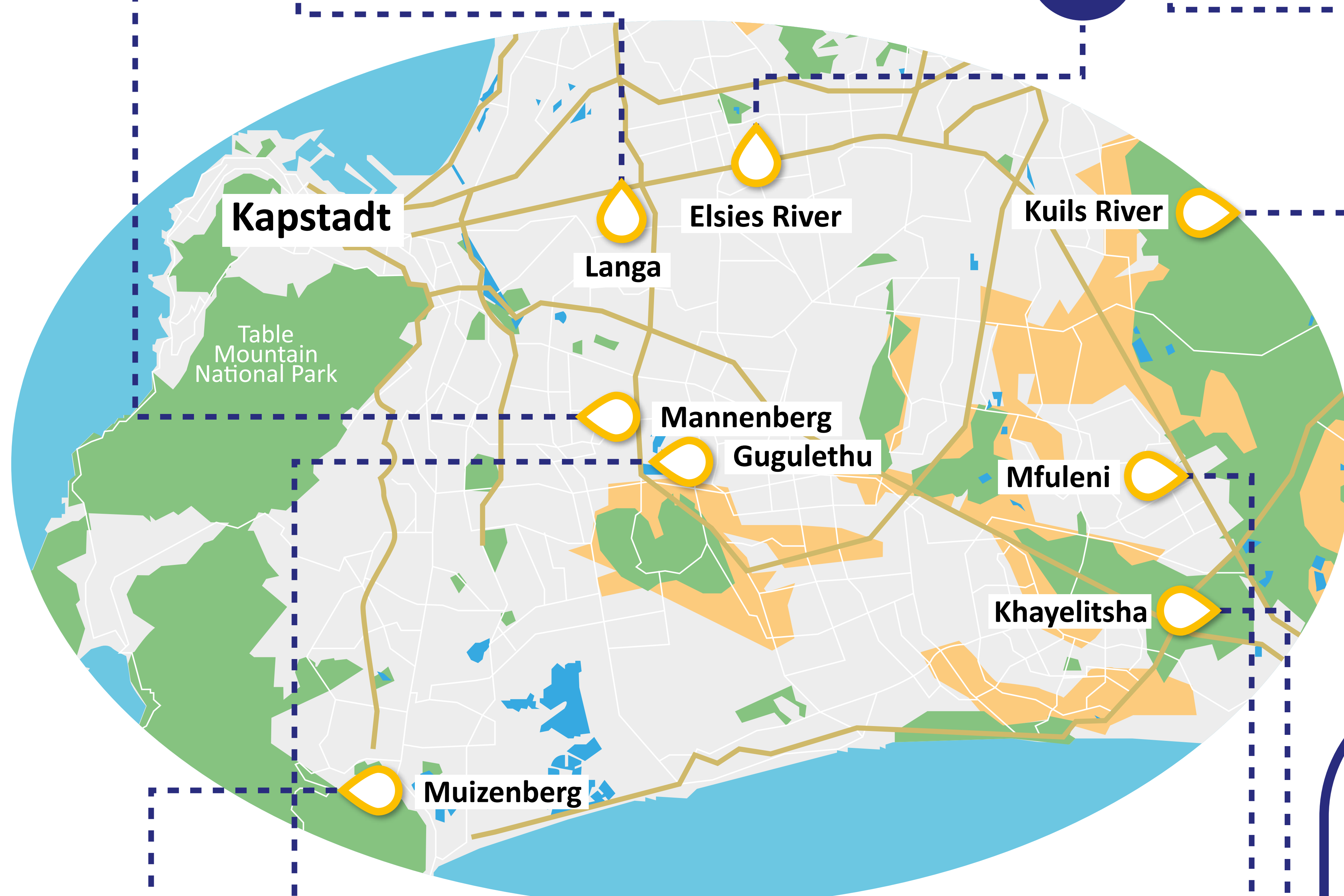
## Primrose Park Primary School

The elementary school has created a "Peace Garden" for the children to stay and a vegetable garden. Each class receives a bed and is responsible for the growing vegetables, which are used for the school kitchen.



## Garden Boyz – Feed The Future

Three young men have started an initiative to grow vegetables in Elsies River. They run two gardens. Geronimo de Klerk is a founding member.



Since last year, Sophumla Ntoyabo has been rebuilding the Ubuhle@Bulumko food garden on a school property.

## Moya We Khaya

The garden has been working as a cooperative for 8 years. 14 people - mostly women - intensively cultivate an area of 1 ha.



## GAPA – Grandmothers Against Poverty & Aids

In this social institution, the older women of the neighborhood take care of disadvantaged children. The vegetable garden was planted with our help and supplies the community kitchen.



## Ingcungcu Sunbird Restoration

The organization has set itself the goal of replanting the endemic fynbos vegetation typical of Cape Town in the form of corridors. The project is supported by three organizations in Cape Town. These corridors will be created in a kind of stepping stone system, formed by a smaller or larger garden. The goal is also the settlement of the Ingungcu Sunbird.



## Amava Oluntu – Community Garden

The Muizenberg Community Garden is an initiative of Muizenberg CAN. It serves as a social meeting place, and at the same time it is a vegetable supplier for the Muizenberg Community Kitchen.



## FACT – Food Agency Cape Town

In the middle of Mfuleni, a township with very high immigration, Hazel Nyaba runs her garden. The vegetables produced are delivered to the Uphakanini Community Kitchen.



## GUFFI - Gugulethu Forest + Farming Initiative

"Make Gugulethu Green again – street by street". With this program, the initiative has set itself the goal of greening as many gardens as possible in the neighborhood in the center of Gugulethu. Neighbors are encouraged and guided to turn their backyard into a vegetable garden.
